





Case Study: Cross Country

The Greatest race no one sees

Once the pinnacle of endurance racing
No viable business model
Grassroots ≠ Ecosystem

• No clear audience, no consistent identity

EUROPEAN ATHLETICS HIGH PERFORMANCE CONFERENCE MADRID 2025

Lowest grassroots participation among stadium disciplines	Limited appreciation outside Europe	Fewer than 15% of non- European federations organize national championships
Consistently ranks low in being "easy to follow"	The Decathlon struggles to fit into the current TV scheduling framework.	Unique blend of limited international depth and high athlete churn

Case study: Take-Off Zone

EUROPEAN ATHLETICS HIGH PERFORMANCE CONFERENCE MADRID 2025

- Identified weakness: 31% of all jumps are fouls
- Valid jumps generate far more positive fan reaction compared to fouls
- A 40cm take-off zone decrease foul rate to 10%

Case Study: World Championships

In the last 10 years:

- 19% more athletes at WCH
- 2 additional disciplines
- Reduced total duration


Since 1983:

- Athletes per discipline average increased by 19%
- Field event athlete average increased by 35%
